

## Written declaration of being asymptomatic

*Written declaration of being asymptomatic is presented in order to ensure a safe environment in schools and school facilities in order to ensure the safety and health of children and students according to § 152 letter c) law nr. 245/2008 and its amendments regarding education and upbringing, thus to maintain education in presence in school and minimizing the risk of interruptions in classroom education.*

According to § 144 section 7 letter d) of law nr. 245/2008 and its amendments, I declare that: (mark "X")

- child/student does not have any of the following symptoms:** excessive fatigue, headache and body ache, fever, skin rash, signs of respiratory disease (rhinitis, sore throat, loss of smell and taste, cough, difficulty breathing), signs of gastrointestinal disease (abdominal pain, vomiting, diarrhoea),
- the regional public health institute nor the general health practitioner for children and adolescents **has not ordered a quarantine** measure for the child/ student,
- child/student **was not within the last 5 days in a close contact<sup>1</sup> with a COVID-19 positive person,<sup>2</sup>**
- if child/student was within the last 5 days abroad:**  
and is less than **12 years and 2 months old:**
- together with persons living in the same household after entering the territory of the Slovak Republic have fulfilled the obligations of home isolation for 5 days, or received a negative PCR test result, which was performed after entering the territory of the Slovak Republic, or applies the status of fully vaccinated persons<sup>3</sup> or has overcome COVID-19 illness less than 180 days ago,
- and is **more than 12 years and 2 months old:**
- after entering the territory of the Slovak Republic has fulfilled the obligation of home isolation for 5 days, or received a negative result of the PCR test after entering the territory of the Slovak Republic, or applies the status of a fully vaccinated person<sup>3</sup> or has overcome COVID-19 illness less than 180 days ago.

**I am aware that in the event of a change in health status and showing of the above-mentioned symptoms of the disease, the child/student must stay at home and cannot attend school.** I am also aware of the legal consequences in the event of a false declaration, in particular I am aware that I would have committed an offense under § 21 section 1 letter f) law nr. 372/1990 regarding offences.

<sup>1</sup> close contact is a person's contact with a person positive for disease if, on such contact, they did not have their upper respiratory tract covered by an FFP2 respirator (and above) and the persons were in direct physical contact or were less than 2 metres apart for more than 5 minutes, or persons have been in an indoor or otherwise enclosed space for more than 5 minutes, or have travelled together by means of transport for more than 5 minutes

<sup>2</sup> category of "frontline" workers (paramedics, firefighters, police officers, etc.) and persons exempted from quarantine comment only on the symptoms of acute illness of their child/student and on the quarantine regulation.

<sup>3</sup> person is considered to be a fully vaccinated person: (a) at least 14 days but not more than 9 months after the application of the second dose of COVID-19 vaccine with a two-dose schedule; (b) at least 21 days but not more than 9 months after the first dose of COVID-19 vaccine with a single dose schedule has been administered, or (c) for at least 14 days and not more than 9 months after the first dose of COVID-19 vaccine has been administered, if the first dose of COVID-19 vaccination has been administered within 180 days of COVID-19.
